Psalm 116:12 says, "What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits to me?"

HELLO Central United Methodist Church.

I have been reading *God Unbound* by Dr. Elaine Heath and it is a really good book. I highly recommend it. At one point in the book Dr. Heath refers to a conversation she has with Wendy Miller who wrote *Jesus Our Spiritual Director: A Pilgrimage through the Gospels.* During their conversation Wendy Miller asks, "Which story are we

living?" It is important from time to time to stop and create some space for discernment. "We need to ask ourselves; Are we living the Gospel story or living the world's story?"

I think this is true of churches. We need to be asking ourselves if we are living into the Gospel story, or the world's story? Did you know there is no shortage of "church growth" books? If you don't believe me just do a search on Google, or visit your local library and see how big the section is on church growth. I was reading a devotion by a fellow named Charlie Crow this morning and he asks this question, "Are we measuring church growth by the right score card?"


In business we can measure success by how many customers we have and how much money we make over cost. With churches—especially Methodist churches—we become hung up on the numbers. Every year we fill out statistical reports

detailing how many baptisms, how many new members, how many in attendance and why. These are tangible, measurable ways to assess church growth. However, I wonder if they are not the wrong score cards for a church?

The danger of using numbers in the pews as a measurement of successful church growth is it leads to churches which are heavy on polished, charismatic preachers; exciting, entertaining worship, and low obedience from the congregants. The people who come to worship are looking to be fed like babies in a high chair instead of Gospel farm hands looking to eat quick, and clean up quick so they can get back out to the field.

Is our church living the world's story with its focus on posteriors in pews, or is our church living a gospel focus with God living in our hearts and minds as our feet and hands reach out for those in need both inside and outside of our doors? What are you doing to invite God into your heart and mind? What should we be doing to share God with those in need? What does your score card reveal?


