



The question tickled me, so I told him, "When a new baby comes into the house things are not ever normal again. Normal just begins to look like something else." We both laughed at that, and he told me, "I've been there."

Something happens, we get a new pastor, or take on a new project, the pastor offers a stewardship series, and once it is all said and done we are as eager to get back to, "Normal," as we can. 
