

### Words from Warren...

The season of Thanksgiving is just around the corner. Take this opportunity to read this true story to prepare yourself to be thankful.

Governor William Bradford of the Massachusetts Bay Colony did not have much to encourage him during the bleak days of 1621. A "great

sickness" had come over the colony of pilgrims. During the winter, it had taken in death 13 of the 24 heads of families, all the wives except 4 and all but 6 of the bachelor men. Food was extremely scarce. The Mayflower had sailed back to England for additional supplies. The climate was harsh, hunger prevailed, hard work, the fear of the Indians all around them plus a summer drought nearly sapped the last vestige of hope. For a period of time food was so scarce that the daily rations were only five kernels of corn per person. In the fall of that



very first year of their hardship, Bradford set aside a solemn day for public thanksgiving for the things they did possess. They set at a table with all of seasonal favorites, wild turkey, dressing, cranberries, raised

vegetables and pies made from fresh pumpkins.

That first thanksgiving had be set aside by Governor Bradford, as a public day of giving thanks. The pilgrims established the custom of placing five kernels of corn beside their plate as a memorial of those difficult days. It was a way to remember and give thanks to almighty God for all His blessings. Here is a real spirit of Thanksgiving. I can and will be thankful to God for what I have, even though these goods cannot be measured much in worldly values. May you often count your blessings this Thanksgiving and on into the Christmas season and beyond.. Happy Holidays! Rev. Wassen Mills









#### **Believers Learning and Sharing Together**
