

When we are saved we are to accept Jesus Christ as both our Lord and Savior. Savior is nice because it is rescue from sin and death. However, accepting Christ as Lord is harder because we have to keep our promises and do what God commands.

In our Scripture Jeremiah holds Israel accountable for their pie crust promises. Israel refused to walk in God's ways. Israel refused to listen. Israel rejected the Law. Israel would not pay attention to the Word of God so God allowed destruction to fall upon them.

Are we keeping our promises? Will we suffer Israel's fate? Will our church be closed because we failed to keep our promises? John Wesley once said, 'I am not afraid that the people called Methodists should ever cease to exist either in Europe or America. But I am afraid lest they should only exist as a dead sect, having the form of religion without the power. And this undoubtedly will be the case unless they hold fast both the doctrine, spirit, and discipline with which they first set out.' ('Thoughts Upon Methodism,' 1786.) This will be the case when we make a habit of breaking our promises to love God and love one another, and by failing to do no harm, do good, and attend to the ordinances of God.


The UMW are collecting clothes for AGAPE. This year it will be for children sizes 2-14, especially boys. You may drop off your new with tags at the church.




Do you enjoy reading? Central UMW has a great collection of spiritual and uplifting books for you to check out. The books are in the hut and are available for checking out.


